



K5 – GRADE 12 LOW INCOME AND HARDSHIP SCHOLARSHIPS

CCA chose to name its low-income and hardship scholarship program in honor of the Protestant reformer, Martin Luther. Here's why. Luther discovered a copy of the Scriptures, read them and came to salvation. Knowing what the Scriptures did for him, he translated the Scriptures into the German language of his day only to realize that few Germans could read. Luther believed that the Germans would not become Christians unless they could and did read the Scriptures. Luther began a crusade to persuade the Germans to appropriate money to pay for schools for all children. The citizens agreed and the modern school movement was born.

Parents of students in K5 through grade twelve who are experiencing serious financial difficulties may apply for a low-income and hardship scholarship. The amount of money in this fund will vary from year to year. There are no guarantees. All applicants will be notified sometime before school begins if there are sufficient funds to award the scholarship they applied for.
